Introducing Our New Teachers



Milena Petrović

Milena is an English language teacher and a doctoral student at the Faculty of Philology, University of Belgrade. She holds a Bachelor's degree in English Language and Literature and a Master's degree in Language and Literature, both from the Faculty of Philology, University of Belgrade. She has worked as an English language instructor for elective courses at the Faculty of Philology in Belgrade. Additionally, she has participated in international conferences and academic symposia, including the ELTA Conference, the Contemporary Studies in Language and Literature Symposium, and the international conference Language, Literature, and Dialogue. She is the recipient of the Prof. Dr. Sonja Dekanić Janoski Award for Student of the Year (2018/2019) and a scholarship from the Ministry of Education of the Republic of Serbia for exceptionally gifted students (2017-2023). She has participated in the following projects: the Trans-Atlantic & Pacific Project: Cross-Cultural UX Project and PARCOLAB Parallel Corpus.

Dr Tin Lukić

Tin is a geography teacher who holds a PhD in Geosciences from the Faculty of Sciences, University of Novi Sad. He previously worked as an Associate Professor in the Department of Physical Geography at the Faculty of Sciences, University of Novi Sad. He has been involved in numerous national and international research projects.

He is the author and co-author of over 90 scientific papers published in international journals indexed in the SCI list. Additionally, he has contributed as an author and co-author to two university study guides (Climatology and Pedology; Cartography with Topography) and three university textbooks (Biogeography with Pedology; Medical Geography; Remote Sensing in Environmental Studies).

He is also a member of the editorial board and a co-author of accompanying texts on physical geography in The Great Atlas of Serbia, a major national publication published by the Official Gazette of the Republic of Serbia, Belgrade.



His professional memberships include the Serbian Geographical Society (SGD), the Loess Research Group, PAGES (Past Global Changes), and the European Geosciences Union (EGU).

In recognition of his contributions to science and research, he received the Faculty of Sciences Award for Outstanding Scientific Achievement in 2016, earning the title of Best Young Scientist of the Faculty of Sciences. In 2022, he was recognized for scientific excellence as the second most-cited researcher in the fields of geography, tourism, and hospitality in the Autonomous Province of Vojvodina. This recognition was awarded by the Provincial Secretariat for Higher Education and Scientific Research of AP Vojvodina.
