

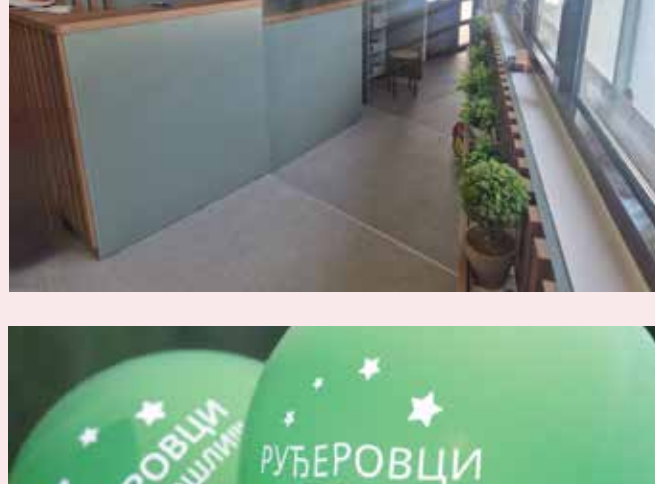

Beginning of the New School Year

Dear students and parents, we are delighted to welcome all our Ruder students back on 1 September. We look forward to seeing everyone again, and especially our PYP students, who will be returning to their renovated school facilities. The welcome reception for our Grade 1 and new Grade 2 students is scheduled for 31 August at 6 pm, and regular classes will begin on 1 September, according to the timetable sent to parents.

We would also like to inform you of some changes to the school leadership team. As Jelena Poznić, our former School Principal, takes on the role of Admissions & Operations Manager within the school leadership team, Nena Šurlan, a member of our school community since 2005, has been appointed Primary School Principal.



Traffic conditions on the school campus have been improved. In the area near the lower car park, we now have two traffic lanes, each 2.7 metres wide, as well as wider parking spaces, improving both traffic flow and safety within the campus. This means that the road by the lower car park is now fully open to two-way traffic.

Final Exam Results

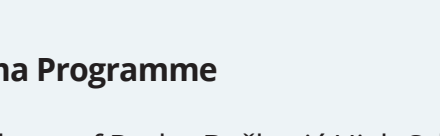


The Primary School Final Exam is an important milestone in our students' education. It is the first time they face such a significant challenge and the considerable pressure that comes with it. We are proud that our students performed so well in this important test of their knowledge. Among the 17 primary schools in the Čukarica municipality, our school ranked third. A total of 21 students took the Primary School Final Exam, with eight students scoring more than 92 points. The highest score achieved was 97.62 points.

Exam Results

MYP Personal project

We are proud to share the outstanding results achieved by our MYP students in their Personal Projects. Our students achieved an impressive average score of 5.09, significantly above the global average of 3.99. More than one-third of our students achieved the highest grades, 6 or 7, demonstrating their commitment, creativity and dedication to their projects. Congratulations to all our students on this outstanding achievement, and many thanks to their mentors and teachers for their guidance, support and dedication.



Diploma Programme

All students of Ruder Bošković High School who sat their examinations in the May 2026 session successfully earned their IB Diploma. With this achievement, our school has once again achieved a 100% pass rate this year.

Although the maximum number of points was 38, we are proud to highlight that in more than half of the subjects (English A, English B, German B, Italian B, Spanish ab initio, Economics, Global Politics, Psychology HL, Biology SL, Computer Science HL, Math AI and AA SL), the average scores were significantly above the world averages. The average score achieved by this year's cohort was 31 points, with an average grade of 4.82.

We congratulate all our graduates on their outstanding achievements and wish them every success as they continue their academic journeys at prestigious institutions such as the Bartlett School of Architecture, IE University Madrid, the University of Amsterdam, Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, King's College London, and IED Torino.



Our Students' Achievements

Petar won a gold medal at the 22nd International Geography Olympiad – iGeo 2026, held in Istanbul. This year's Olympiad brought together 184 of the world's top young geographers from 50 countries, who competed in geographical knowledge, data analysis and fieldwork.



The International Young Physicists' Tournament (IYPT) was held in Zurich, Switzerland, from 5 to 12 July 2026. The Serbian national team, whose members included Petar Tolimir, a third-year student at our high school, achieved a historic success by winning a silver medal in competition with teams from 40 countries.



Mara Stanišić, a third-year student at our high school, won second place at the International Mathematics, Science & Engineering Fair (IMSEF), held in Izmir, Türkiye, from 1 to 6 June 2026, with her research project on the potential use of Tenebrio molitor larvae in the biodegradation of Styrofoam.

By winning medals at international competitions, Petar and Mara achieved outstanding success on the world stage, once again demonstrating that young people from Serbia can reach the very top through knowledge and dedication.

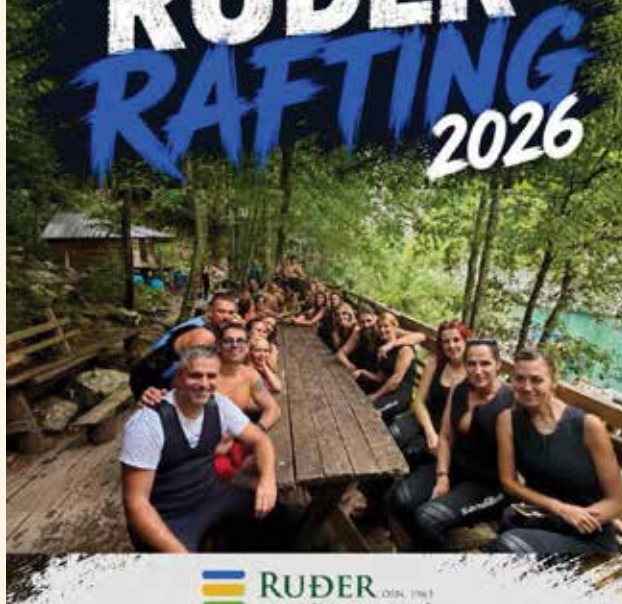
Autumn School Trips
